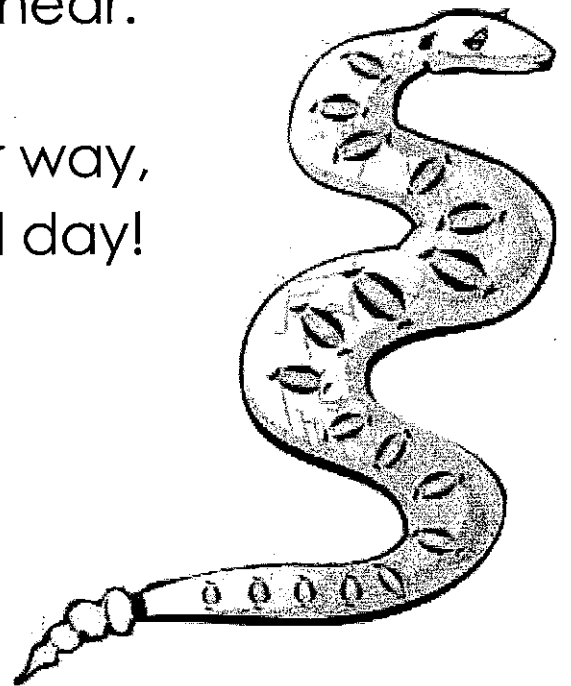
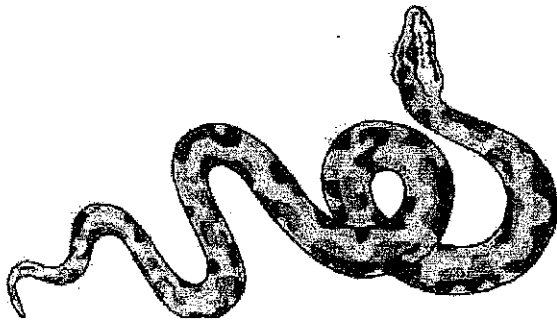


A snake can glide from side to side.

And hiss a threat for you to hear.

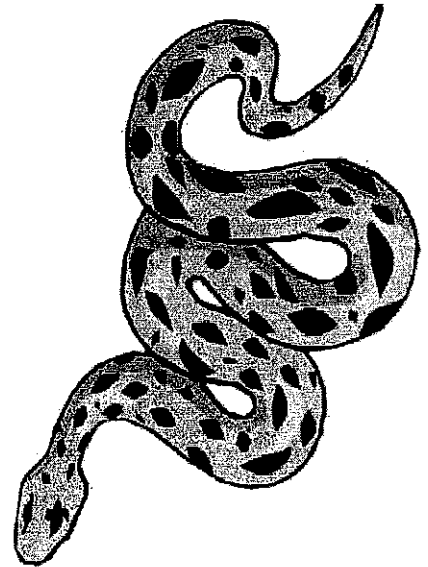
It's wise of you to clear their way,

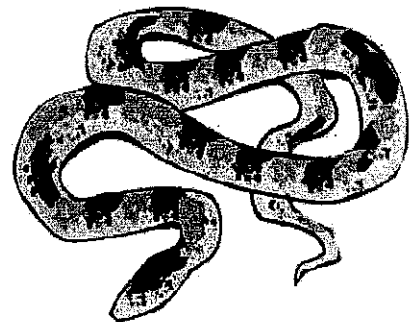

Each one knows just what she does,

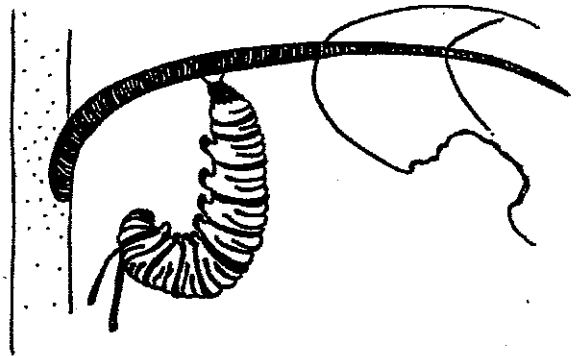
Insects, insects everywhere,

Now it's out the door!

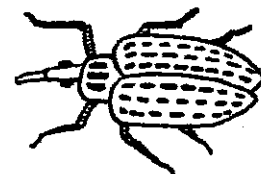
